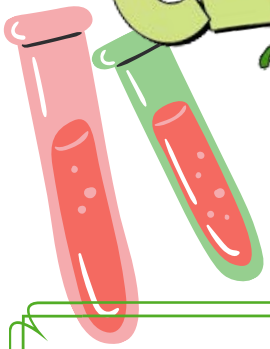

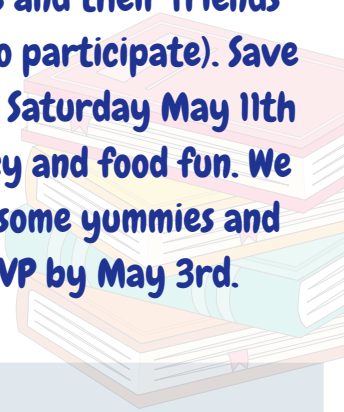

4-H Cloverbud Participation

PURPOSE OF THE CLOVERBUD PROGRAM:
The overall purpose of the 4-H Cloverbud program is to foster the development of life skills that are essential for the cognitive, social, emotional, and physical maturation of kindergarten through 2nd graders by providing a unique educational opportunity. Children in these grades are a distinct audience for 4-H, with unique learning characteristics and developmental needs that are different from older children and youth served through 4-H membership. As a result, the 4-H Cloverbuds program is designed with specific educational objectives and program policies focused on the kindergarten-2nd grade child.

Reminder: Cloverbuds in Chaves County have their own age appropriate projects in which they are enrolled. Chaves County Cloverbuds meet every other month to develop life skills and complete their projects during county club meetings, where 4-H project workshops (sewing, leathercraft, dog, shooting sports, etc.) are scheduled for traditional members (those who are 8 and in the 3rd grade or 9 to 18.) The Cloverbud program is a great opportunity and makes it easier for our Cloverbuds to transition into becoming a traditional 4-H member.

The Little Books Little Cooks program is specifically for Cloverbuds and their friends (don't have to be enrolled to participate). Save the Date and plan to join us Saturday May 11th at 11:30 am for some literacy and food fun. We will have story time, cook some yummys and enjoy at 11:30 Please RSVP by May 3rd.

What is Welding???

James Forrest: Chaves County 4-H Welding Ambassador

What is welding you may ask? Welding in general is a process in which two metal pieces whether similar or dissimilar may be joined by heating them to a temperature high enough to fuse the metals with or without the application of pressure and with or without the aid of filler material being used. To do this you will need a welding machine. A welding machine is used to create the heat and apply the filler metal. The filler metal is supplied to form the joint, either from the electrode itself or by the filler material. The temperature of the heat produced is of the order of 6,000 degrees to 7,000 degrees Celsius.

The application of welding is so different and significant that it would be no exaggeration to say that there is no metal industry and no branch of engineering that does not use welding in one form or another, namely the automobile industry, ships, aerospace and construction. It is majorly used for fabrication. There are a variety of welding processes that can be used to do this. The types of welding processes according to the method of heat generated are: MIG welding, TIG welding, Stick welding, Flux cord arc welding, Plasma Arc welding, Electron beam welding, Laser beam welding, Gas welding, Atomic hydrogen welding, and Electroslag welding.

Now lets talk about some of the advantages of the welding process as well as some of the disadvantages. First starting with the advantages of the welding process: a good weld will be stronger than the parent or base metal, faster process compared to riveting and casting, complete rigid joints can be provided with the welding process, applicable to all metals and alloys, complex shapes can be produced by welding, the welding equipment is portable and can easily be maintained, the welding process requires less workspace in comparison to riveting. Now on to the disadvantages of the welding process, the inspection of welding work is more complex and costlier than the riveting work, welding does give out harmful fumes and spotless (a sudden sprinkle of sparks).

Wrapping things up, now you know welding is a strong joining process in which two metal parts join together to form one part by heating the metals to their melting points. Some types of welding are made by machines and need costly specialized equipment. Welding is a much faster method related to riveting and/or casting.
